# Purpose of the current Bylaw

- Regulate trading activities, events and filming in council-controlled public places
- These activities must either obtain an approval and/or comply with conditions
- Its objective is to minimise public safety risks, nuisance and the misuse of council-controlled public places



# Trading and Events in Public Places Bylaw 2015 review



- The current bylaw will expire in February 2022
- Our review determined that the Bylaw is well used, fills a regulatory gap and continues to be an appropriate way to manage these activities
- Council decided a new bylaw is required
- Potential improvements to the current Bylaw have been identified and added to a proposed new bylaw

# Proposed new bylaw

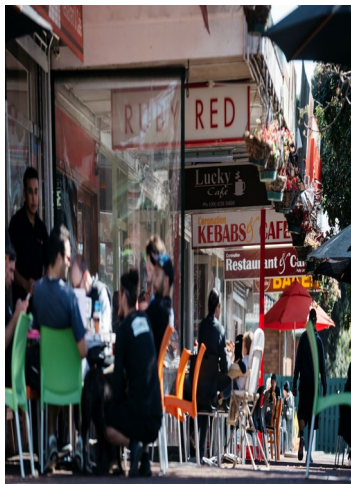
## Public Trading, Events and Filming Bylaw 2022

- Continue to regulate activities in a similar way to the current Bylaw
- Micromobility devices to be approved under their own license
- Clarify which activities require an approval, are subject to conditions, or are not addressed in a new bylaw
- Update structure, form and wording to make a new bylaw more user friendly

# Matters out of scope (not open for public feedback)

- Activities on privately owned places
- Bylaw cannot control certain aspects of rental micromobility devices that are regulated by central government legislation such as:
  - where users ride
  - the use of helmets
  - setting of speed limits
  - suitability of hardware or firmware

# Public engagement



- Consultation is scheduled for **8 June to 16 July 2021**
- Bylaw Panel (3 councillors and an Independent Māori Statutory Board member)
- Stakeholders will be notified by email
- A mix of in-person and online engagement events
- Further opportunities to submit feedback in post, email or phone
