

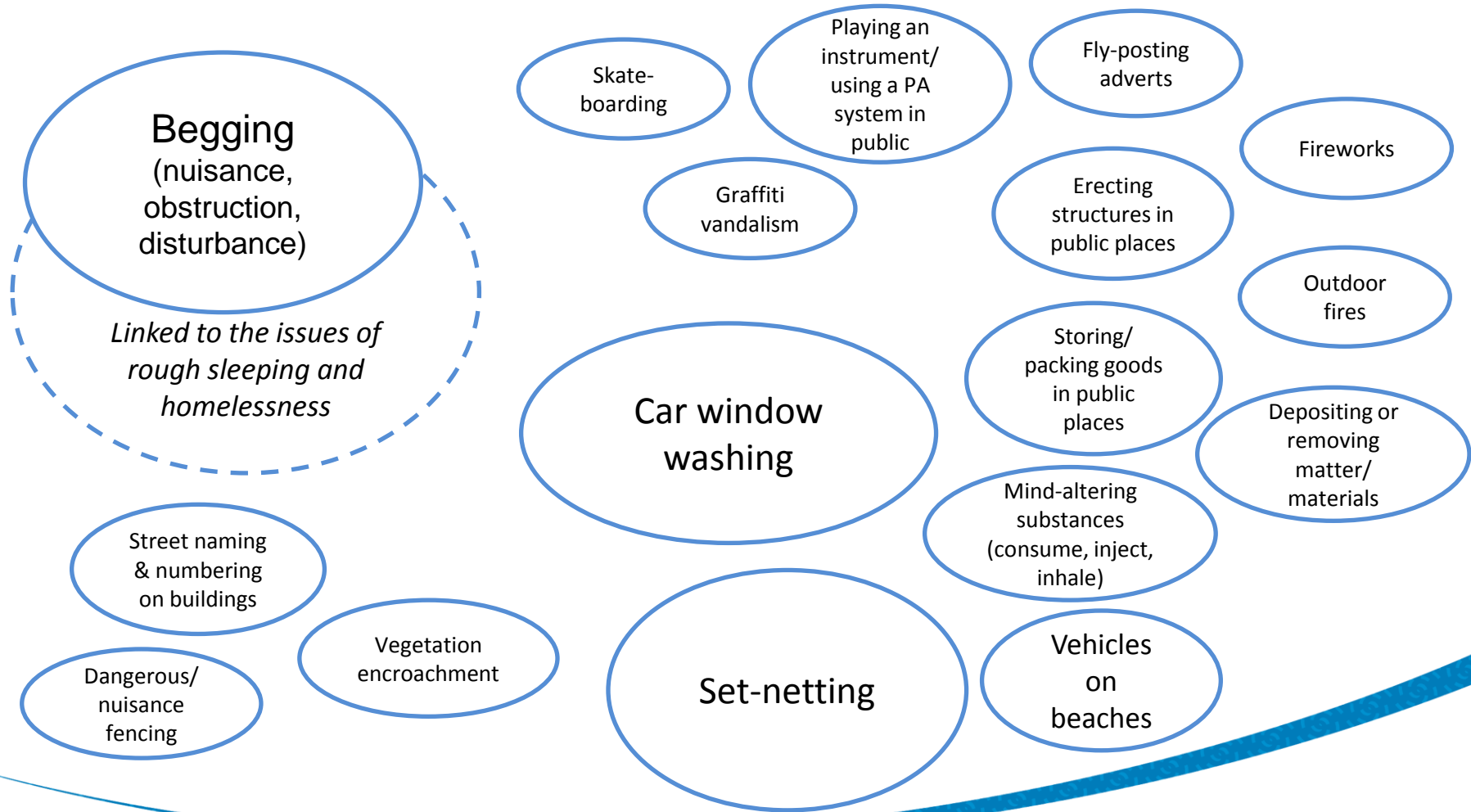

Public Safety and Nuisance Bylaw Issues



Bylaw clustered under five headings

Nuisance, safety and
behaviour

Damage

Obstruction

Additional controls for
parks and beaches

Street naming and
numbering on buildings

Emerging issues from city intensification and growth

Recreational activities creating nuisance for residents

Conflict over use of communal spaces (reserves, parks)

Approach to the review

- key questions

- Is the problem that the bylaw set out to address still a problem?
- How effective has the bylaw been in addressing the problem?
- What other, regulatory or non-regulatory measures can council adopt to address or mitigate the problems identified?
- Are there other new public safety and nuisance issues that we should consider for inclusion in the bylaw?

Approach to the review

- research and engagement

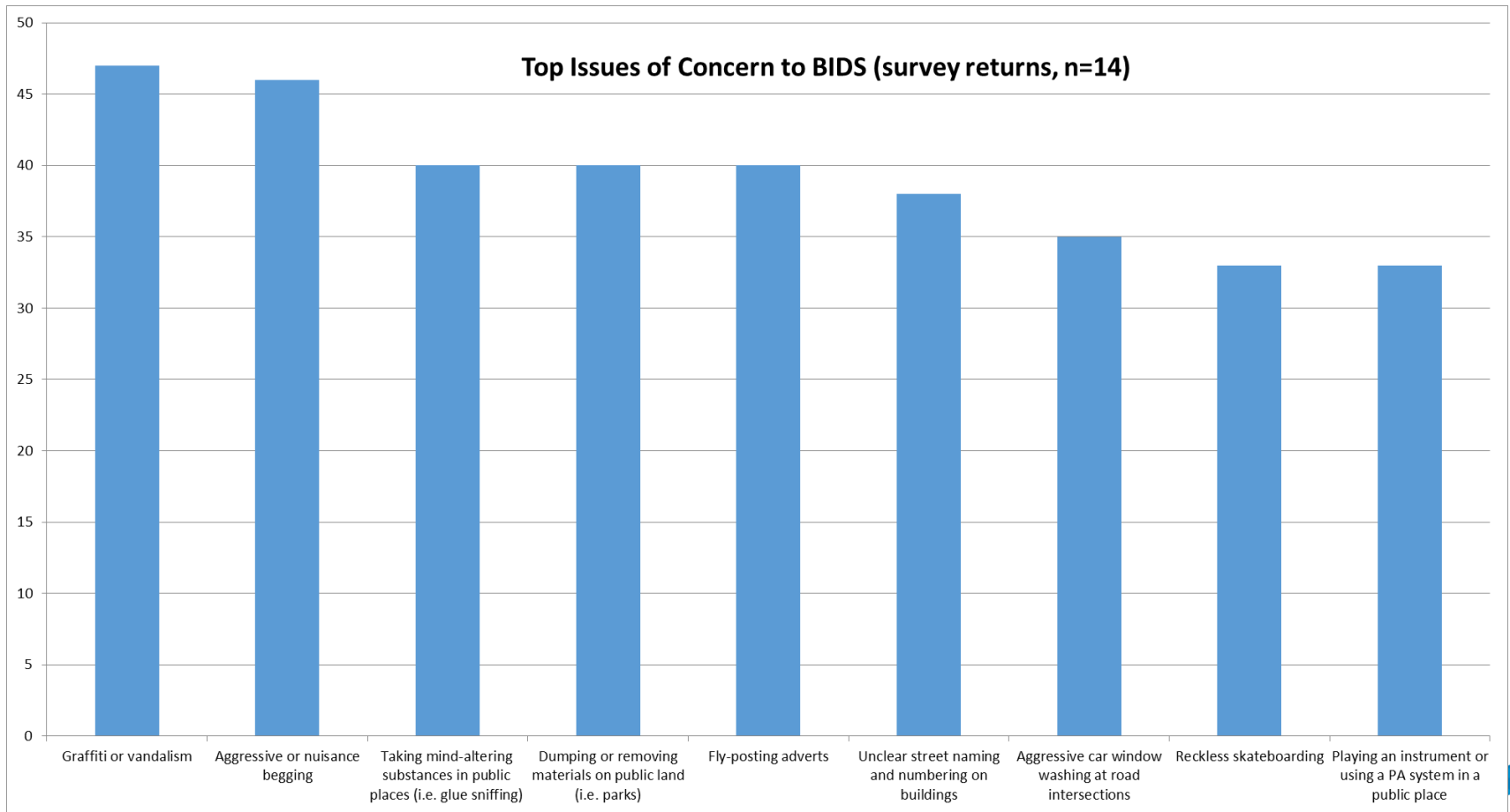
- Broad engagement with a range of stakeholders and groups
- Specific focus upon reaching 'hard to reach' groups
- Focus group research
- Attitudes and perceptions research with a representative sample of Aucklanders
- Analysis of council complaints data

- Research and engagement complete by end of June 2017
- Report to Regulatory Committee in September 2017
